



The new Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)

- The QCE is Queensland's senior schooling qualification
- All Years 11 & 12 students work towards gaining their QCE by the end of Year 12
- Students need to accrue 20 credits minimum (1 per unit per successful subject result)

General and Applied subjects

General subjects:

- Are suited to students who are primarily interested in tertiary pathways
- Includes external exams set by the QCAA
- Academically rigorous

Applied subjects:

- Are suited to students who are primarily interested in pathways that lead to:
 - studying at TAFE
 - undertaking a Traineeship or Apprenticeship
 - moving directly into work
- Internal assessment only no external exams
- Less academically strenuous



VET (Vocational Education & Training) Subjects

VET Subjects:

- Are suited to students who are primarily interested in:
 - further study at TAFE
 - undertaking a Traineeship or Apprenticeship
 - moving directly into work
- Theory units and practical assessment
- Less academically strenuous

Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR)

The ATAR:

- is a system of ranking students from 99.95 (highest) down to 0 in increments of 0.05 (with scores below 30 not being reported on specifically)
- indicates a student's position relative to other students
- QTAC will use scaling to calculate ATAR rank
- allows students to have their senior results used to apply for tertiary institutions in other states as it is a nationally recognised ranking system
- replaces the OP tertiary entrance rank with an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank.

Calculating the ATAR:

QTAC will calculate ATARs based on either a students:

- best 5 General subject results, or
- best results in a combination of 4 General subject results + 1 Applied subject result OR 4 General subject results + a completed VET Certificate III or higher

If a student is eligible for an ATAR in both of the above categories, QTAC will use their highest ATAR.

ATAR – English is a Compulsory Subject

- Students must successfully complete one of the following:
- English
- English & Literature Extension
- Literature
- Essential English

English will only be included in the ATAR calculation if it is one of the student's best five subjects


Selecting Subjects for Year 10

AARA

Access Arrangements and Reasonable Adjustments (AARA)

AARA is not granted should a student miss an assessment for family holidays, for example (specifically applied in Years 10-12)

Study Habits

- Regular practice of work at home

Line Formation Process

- Constructing the Timetable Line Structure factors:
 - Student needs
 - Student numbers
 - Staffing
 - Facilities/resources
 - Putting preferences in order is a MUST!
- College creates lines based on 'best-fit', and in the past we have been able to accommodate 95% or better of students preferred subjects






The following steps outline how to enter your subject preferences online.

1 Internet Access	You will need a computer with an internet connection and a printer. We recommend using Google Chrome or Firefox.				
Access	Click here to open Web Preferences				
2 Log In	Or Log In to https://www.selectmysubjects.com.au/student using: Click here - this will take you directly to the Web Preferences Student Portal Password: 4C2BG3				
3 Home Page	To view your subject information click "View Subject Details" at the top right of the screen. To select/change your preferences, click "Add New Preferences" at the top right of the screen.				
4 Preference Selection	Select your subjects from the drop down lists, you have 30 minutes to do so. Once complete, click "Proceed". Note: You are not finished yet.				
<u>5</u> Preference Validation	If you are happy with your preferences click "Submit Valid Preferences" which will open your "Preference Receipt". Or if you would like to make changes to your preferences click "Cancel" and this will take you back to the Preference Selection page.				
<u>6</u> Preference Receipt	You can print your "Preference Receipt" by clicking "Open Print View" and clicking "Print Receipt". To continue click "Return to Home Page". If you want to change your preferences, repeat the process by clicking "Add New Preferences", otherwise exit by clicking "Log Out". End of steps.




